ORDER:

The Government of Telangana launched a major drive to make the State free from **Gudumba (Illicit Distillation)** . The Gudumba Free Drive was in operation from 01.01.2015 to 30.9.2016.

2. Accordingly a massive campaign involving people's representatives, officials of various departments and local residents in Gudumba endemic localities was launched to create awareness on ill effects of Gudumba , administration of public pledge to stop Gudumba and wean away persons / families engaged in Gudumba related activities. Criminal cases were registered against persons engaged in preparation , transportation and sale of Gudumba. These persons were bound over under Section 109 and 110 of the Criminal Procedure Code (CrPC) for good behavior.

3. It has been represented that these persons / families engaged in Gudumba related activities belong to weaker sections particularly Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Backward Castes etc. . The Gudumba effected persons / families who depended on Gudumba for their survival need special assistance for alternate sustainable livelihood so that they do not relapse into Gudumba related activities .

4. The Commissioner of Prohibition & Excise, Telangana State, Hyderabad has provided district-wise numbers of Gudumba effected persons identified during the Gudumba Free Drive with caste wise break up. The same is enclosed as Annexure.

5. After careful examination of the matter, the Government have decided to rehabilitate the Gudumba Effected Persons under specially designed Gudumba Effected Persons Rehabilitation Scheme as part of the Economic Support Scheme of various Welfare Departments. The Gudumba Effected Persons would be rehabilitated with viable and suitable productive assets depending upon their skills, experience, interest and local conditions to ensure sustainable livelihood.

6. The Gudumba Effected Persons Rehabilitation Scheme District wise Welfare Department wise allocations are indicated in the Annexure. The Scheme does not have any bank loan component. The entire amount of the Scheme is grant to ensure smooth and speedy rehabilitation.

7. The allocations indicated in the Annexure is the outer limit. The actual unit cost would vary based on the economic activity and productive assets identified for the beneficiary. The District Collector shall ensure that all the identified beneficiaries are rehabilitated within the allocation of the Welfare Departments concerned in the District. No request for additional allocation for rehabilitation would be entertained on grounds that higher unit costs assets have been identified.

8. The Gudumba Effected Persons Rehabilitation Scheme budget allocated from the budget provision of the Welfare Departments as part of the Economic Support Scheme is as follows:

Eligibility Criteria

9. The eligibility criteria for coverage under the Scheme are as follows :
- i. Excise case should have been registered under relevant sections of the Telangana Excise Act 1968 on Gudumba Effected Person or he/she should have been bound over under provisions of CrPC for indulging in Gudumba Activities during the Gudumba Free Drive period i.e. between 1.1.2015 and 30.9.2016 ;
The identified Gudumba Effected Person should NOT have engaged in Gudumba related activities and there should not be any cases registered on illicit distillation post Gudumba Free Drive after 1.10.16 till date on him or her ;
 - iii. The eligibility criteria and norms as envisaged in Economic Support Scheme of respective Welfare Departments should be strictly adhered to unless otherwise specified in this GO ;
 - iv. Only one member in the family shall be eligible for rehabilitation under the Scheme even if cases have been against more than one family members ; and
 - v. Aadhar identification of the beneficiary shall be mandatory to avoid duplicity and impersonation.

Priority for Vulnerable Groups

10. Amongst the identified Gudumba Effected Persons - widows, single women, persons with disability, orphans, and persons affected with HIV shall be given priority in implementation of the Scheme.

Bound Over Before Rehabilitation

11. In order to ensure that after rehabilitation, there is no relapse of the beneficiaries and the immediate family members into Gudumba activity , the identified beneficiaries should assure that they or their family members would NOT engage in Gudumba related activities in future . They should be bound over for a period of (3) years for an total amount not less than Rupees one lakh before grounding of the Scheme.

Role of Various Departments

12. The Prohibition and Excise Superintendent shall be responsible for identification of Gudumba affected persons . In addition, the Prohibition & Excise Department will regularly follow up with the Welfare Departments to ensure effective implementation of the Scheme and will provide handholding support to the beneficiaries in the initial stages of grounding of the Scheme.

13. The District Collector and Magistrate shall ensure that MPDO, concerned Welfare Department and the Excise Department after confirming the eligibility of the Gudumba Effected Person, identify suitable and viable scheme through a consultative process based on skills, experience, interest, local conditions etc.

14. The District Collector & Magistrate shall ensure that quality assets are procured in transparent manner at competitive price following Welfare Departments norms. The concerned technical departments shall be involved in procurement of the assets.

15. The Welfare Departments concerned shall be responsible for ensuring the eligibility of the proposed beneficiaries, grounding of the Scheme, procurement of the assets as per norms, proper documentation etc as in case of Economic Support Schemes .

State and District Level Committees

16. The Government hereby constitute State Level and District Level Committees to ensure proper implementation of the Scheme.

17. The District Level Committee shall have the following composition:

18. The District Collector as Chairperson of the Committee would ensure proper implementation of the Scheme following guidelines and eligibility conditions. The Committee will meet every month once to plan, sanction, release funds, and monitor the implementation of the Scheme.

19. The District Collector & Magistrate would ensure that the Gudumba Affected Persons being rehabilitated under the Scheme are trained to ensure effective use of the productive assets in coordination with the Welfare Departments, Technical Departments and Excise Department.

20. The District Collector & Magistrate would take up special measures to ensure transparency and accountability in finalization of the beneficiaries, procurement of productive assets and grounding of the Scheme.

Action Plan for Rehabilitation

21. A detailed action plan for rehabilitation of the identified beneficiaries should be prepared under the Scheme with Gudumba Affected Person wise details. The action plan should look into other aspects of rehabilitation beyond the Scheme for other members of the Gudumba Affected Families like admission to children in residential schools, skill training to youth, sanction of entitlements like Aasara Pensions, food security cards, MGNREGS job cards as per requirement and entitlements.

22. In addition to beneficiary wise details, the action plan should comprise of reasons for the villages or habitations being susceptible for Gudumba and propose suitable measures to combat those causal factors dovetailing other resources available in the District.

The State Level Committee

23. The State level committee shall have the following composition:

24. The State Level Committee will meet once in every quarter to monitor the progress of the Scheme and recommend additional measures for smooth implementation.

Third Party Evaluation

25. The entire implementation of the Scheme shall be evaluated by a third party to be identified by the Government to assess the socio-economic impact of the Scheme.

26. All the concerned officers and departments shall take necessary action in the matter accordingly.
